his four-session fly tying class will take participants through tying local patterns. We will focus on both wet/nymph and dry/caddis style patterns. This is not a beginner class – participants need to have enough experience to tie independently and keep up with the instructor's pace. Anyone concerned with their skill level is encouraged to contact the instructor to discuss this. Each fly will build on the tyers' skills and increase their techniques and ability to tie flies outside of class.

Materials, tools and vise will all be supplied by the instructor, but students may bring their own vise, tools and thread if desired. A \$15 materials fee per student is included in the course registration fee.

Scott Biron is a master fly tyer and instructor for NH Fish & Game and is popular tying and instructing both nationally and internationally. He is a master artist in the New Hampshire Traditional Arts Program, with a strong interest in historical New Hampshire fly tyers and their lost patterns. He has published, researched, instructed and demonstrated many of these lost New Hampshire fly patterns. Scott is considered an expert on large group instruction and offers dozens of classes year-round. He is an ambassador for the American Museum of Fly Fishing and a regular contributor to the Fly Dressers Guild Journal and the New Hampshire Wildlife Journal. He is on the pro team with Partridge of Redditch, Sprite Hooks, HMH Vises and Ewing Feather Birds. Ewing has come out with a signature series line of feathers under Scott's name.
